Proposed Bylaw Changes

The President, with the approval of the Board of Directors, may designate one or more special or standing committees to assist the Board of Directors in management of the corporation; provided, however, the designation of such committees and the delegation thereto of authority shall not operate to relieve the Board of Directors, or any individual director, of any responsibility imposed upon them by law. The standing committees may consist, but not be limited to the following:

- (a) Program/Education.
- (b) Membership.
- (c) Nominating.
- (d) Conference.

Bylaw currently reads:

ARTICLE X - NOMINATING COMMITTEE; Section 3, Ballots. The mailed ballots will be mailed to all members in good standing at the address on file with the corporation at least forty-five (45) days prior to the sixth (6th) meeting of the year. Ballots shall be mailed to the Nominating Committee Chairperson who will cause to have the ballots counted. In case of a tie, the name shall be drawn by lot. The results will be announced at the sixth (6th) meeting of the year.

Proposed bylaw change to read:

ARTICLE X - NOMINATING COMMITTEE; Section 3, Ballots. The ballots will be submitted to all members in good standing at the address on file with the corporation at least forty-five (45) days prior to the sixth (6th) meeting of the year. Ballots shall be sent to the Nominating Committee Chairperson who will cause to

What is Brain Injury?

Every year, 1.7 million Americans sustain a traumatic brain injury. An estimated 5.3 million Americans – a little more than 2 percent of the US population – currently live with disabilities resulting from traumatic brain injury.

An acquired brain injury, sometimes referred to as simply “brain injury”, refers to an injury to the brain that occurs after birth. A traumatic brain injury (TBI) is an insult to the brain caused by an external physical force, and falls under the more general “acquired brain injury” heading. A TBI may produce a diminished or altered state of consciousness, and results in an impairment of cognitive abilities or physical functioning. It can also result in the disturbance of behavioral

or emotional functioning. These impairments may be either temporary or permanent and cause partial or total functional disability or psychosocial maladjustment.

There are many different causes of brain injury, including, but not limited to, car crashes, falls, assaults, sports-related mishaps, stroke, aneurysm, brain tumors, proximity to explosions, exposure to toxic substances and domestic or child abuse. A brain injury may result in impairments in one or more areas, including cognition; speech-language communication; memory; attention and concentration; reasoning; abstract thinking; physical functions; psychosocial behavior; and information processing.

ABLE Act Passes House and Senate

On December 16, 2014, the Senate passed the Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) Act, by a vote of 76-16. The House version of the bill passed on December 3 by a vote of 404-17.

When signed into law, the ABLE Act will allow individuals with disabilities and their families to save and accumulate funds in tax-free savings accounts. These accounts can pay for housing, transportation, home health, and other eligible expenses without jeopardizing benefits and eligibility for Medicaid or Social Security benefits.

Quick Facts About Brain Injury

An estimated 2.4 million children and adults in the U.S. sustain a traumatic brain injury (TBI) and another 795,000 individuals sustain an acquired brain injury (ABI) from non-traumatic causes each year.

Currently more than 5.3 million children and adults in the U.S. live with a lifelong disability as a result of TBI and an estimated 1.1 million have a disability due to stroke.

DID YOU KNOW?

- A concussion is the most common type of brain injury sustained in sports.
- Most concussions do NOT involve loss of consciousness.
- You can sustain a concussion even if you do NOT hit your head. An indirect blow elsewhere on the body can transmit an “impulsive” force to the head and cause a concussion to the brain.
- Multiple concussions can have cumulative and long lasting life changes.
- Concussions typically do NOT appear in neuroimaging studies such as MRI or CAT Scans.
- An estimated 1.6-3.8 million sports- and recreation-related concussions occur in the United States each year.
- Of the 1.4 million traumatic brain injuries sustained by children and adults in the United States each year, at least 75% are mild and/or concussions.
- Among children and youth ages 5–18 years, the five leading sports or recreational activities, which account for concussions, include bicycling, football, basketball, playground activities, and soccer.
