8:30 - 9:45 Keynote: "Laughing Matters", Karla Kay Potetz, MBA, PhD

Andrea is the Deputy Director of Governor's Cabinet Opiate Action Team, State of Ohio, Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services.

1:30 - 2:30 "An Ethical Response to the Opioid Crisis", Joan Papp, MD, FACEP

Describe ethical challenges in addressing opioid crisis from various perspectives. Discuss ethical framework to address each challenge. Tell how to develop a plan to implement an ethical approach to the opioid crisis in your practice. Dr. Papp is the founder and Medical Director for the MetroHealth Cuyahoga County Project DAWN program, an opioid education and naloxone distribution program. **(Fulfills Ethics Requirement)**

2:45 - 3:45 "Medicaid Eligibility", Richard A. Myers Jr., JD

Explain the fundamentals of eligibility for a single or married person. Review the importance of commencing a Medicaid application process early in the admissions process to protect both the care community and the care recipient. Describe methods to preserve the savings of the care recipient during the spend down process. Tell the difference between countable assets and exempt assets in the Medicaid application process. Mr. Myers is an experienced lead attorney in Medicaid Asset Preservation and an Elderlaw Advisor.

4:00 - 5:00 "13 Reasons Why: Understanding Adolescent Suicide", Julia Ellifritt, LISW-S

Despite a concerted effort of education, prevention and stop-bullying campaigns, teen suicide remains an ongoing epidemic. Discuss current trends in suicidology, why teens take their lives, and the role that social media plays in all of it. Tell ways to assess suicidal thinking, identify those at most risk, and clinical interventions to support teens. Ms. Ellifritt is a Clinical Director at Cornerstone of Hope.
