There is a clear dose response relationship between the number of traumatic experiences and increased risk of prescription drug misuse in adults. Describe why drugs can be used for the relief of profound anguish dating back to childhood experiences and how drugs may be the best coping device an individual can find. Increase understanding that negative childhood experiences may disrupt functioning of brain regions associated with impulse control. Describe differences between trauma services and trauma treatment.
